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HAGERTY HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE

School and Community

Hagerty High School, the newest Seminole County public high school, is located in the city of Oviedo, Florida. This rapidly growing community is one mile from the University of Central Florida and one mile from Seminole State College's Oviedo campus. The current enrollment at Hagerty High School is 2,197 students. Hagerty staff focuses on easing our incoming 9th graders' transition to high school and preparing them to succeed academically. There is also a strong focus on advanced academic work in preparation for college and university placement and developing marketable skills for the workplace of the future. Administration and Student Services serve all grade levels.

Faculty

Hagerty High School has nine administrators, six certified school counselors, and 112 certified teachers. Fifty-two percent of the teachers hold advanced degrees and five are National Board Certified Teachers.

Technology

As the newest high school in Seminole County, Hagerty High School is equipped with state of the art technology. This includes 80 computers in the Media Center, ten computer labs, LCD projectors in every classroom and a TV studio with the capability to broadcast through Hagerty's CCTV network. Additionally, twelve laptop cart labs are available for student use.

Student Services

Hagerty High School's Student Services Department provides counseling for grades 9 through 12. Mrs. Jennifer Abercrombie, Dr. Andrea Fuhrer, and Mr. Nick Maby provide academic, career, and personal/social counseling to students with the last name beginning A-M in Student Services, Building 6. Ms. Michelle Cortes, Mrs. Erin Isaacs and Mrs. Joan Toro provide those services to students with the last name N-Z as well as all students in the ESOL and ESE programs in Building 2 Student Services.

Exceptional Education Services

Hagerty High School provides a range of services to support the education of students who are gifted and those who have learning disabilities, emotional behavioral disabilities, speech and language impairments, physical impairments, and students on the autism spectrum disorder. Student services range from self-contained classrooms to full inclusion models.

Student Sports and Activities

Hagerty High School participates at the Varsity level for all sports. In addition to athletic opportunities, students participate in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities such as National Honor Society, all academic honor societies, Band, Choir, Dance Team, International Thespian Society, Newspaper, Yearbook, World Language clubs, SECME and Business Professionals of America to name a few.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The Advanced Placement Program offers students in Grades 9-12 the opportunity to participate in academically accelerated courses in which they may earn both high school and college credit. In May 2020, Hagerty High School administered 1,923 Advanced Placement exams to 916 students and achieved an 82% overall passing rate (the highest in Seminole County).
